AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THREE COURT OFFICERS IN THE DISTRICT COURT OF SPRINGFIELD.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 218 of the General Laws is hereby amended by  
2 striking out section 62 and inserting in place thereof the follow-  
3 ing section:—

4 *Section 62.* In the municipal court of the city of Boston the  
5 court officers appointed shall not exceed ten for criminal business,  
6 one of whom shall be designated by the chief justice as chief court  
7 officer of said court for criminal business and one as an assistant  
8 chief court officer, nor five for civil business, one of whom shall  
9 be designated by said chief justice as chief court officer of said  
10 court for civil business; in the municipal court of the Roxbury  
11 district six court officers may be appointed; in the third district  
12 court of Eastern Middlesex, in the municipal court of the Dor-  
13 chester district, in the municipal court of the West Roxbury  
14 district, and in the district court of Springfield three court  
15 officers may be appointed; in the municipal court of the South  
16 Boston district, of the Charlestown district, the East Boston  
17 district court, the district court of Chelsea, the central district  
18 court of Worcester, the first district court of Eastern Middlesex,  
19 the second district court of Eastern Middlesex, the district  
20 court of Somerville and the district court of East Norfolk two  
21 court officers for each court may be appointed; and in each of  
22 the other district courts in the commonwealth one court officer  
23 may be appointed.
