### AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE OPERATION OF AMBULANCES TRANSPORTING SICK OR INJURED PERSONS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 90 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking  
2 out, in section 7F, in line 6, the word "senior" and inserting in  
3 place thereof the word: — advanced, — so as to read as follows —

4 *Section 7F.* — No person shall operate any ambulance trans-  
5 porting a sick or injured person, and the owner or custodian of an  
6 ambulance shall not permit the same to be so operated upon any  
7 way unless the operator of such ambulance, or an attendant  
8 thereon, has been certified as having successfully completed the  
9 advanced Red Cross course of first-aid training, or its equivalent.
