AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE STATE HOUSING BOARD TO IMPROVE CERTAIN AREAS IN THE CHARLESTOWN DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF BOSTON.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 The state housing board is hereby authorized and directed to
- 2 expend twenty thousand dollars in the Charlestown district of
- 3 the city of Boston to be used in the grading and fencing of those
- 4 sites left vacant as the result of the demolition of vacant run-
- 5 down buildings.

The Constitution of the United States

Article I - Section 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 3. The Senate shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for a Term of six Years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Senators of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
