RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION OF THE RULES, ORDERS, REGULATIONS AND TRANSACTIONS OF THE SCHOOL BUILDING ASSISTANCE COMMISSION.

1 *Resolved*, That an unpaid special commission, to consist of
2 three members of the senate to be designated by the president
3 thereof, five members of the house of representatives to be
4 designated by the speaker thereof, and two persons to be ap-
5 pointed by the governor, is hereby established for the purpose
6 of making an investigation and study of the rules, orders, regula-
7 tions and transactions of the school building assistance commis-
8 sion since its establishment in nineteen hundred and forty-eight,
9 with a view to recommending such changes and additions as
10 may appear necessary or desirable.

11 Said commission shall be provided with quarters in the state
12 house or elsewhere, may hold hearings, may require by summons
13 the attendance and testimony of witnesses and the production
14 of books and papers, may travel within and without the com-
15 monwealth, and may expend for legal, clerical and other assist-
16 ance such sums as may be appropriated therefor. Said commis-
17 sion shall report to the general court the results of its investiga-
18 tion and study, and its recommendations, if any, together with
19 drafts of legislation necessary to carry said recommendations
20 into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the house of
21 representatives on or before the fourth Wednesday of December
22 in the current year.
