HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, January 21, 1958.

The committee on Metropolitan Affairs, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 409) of John B. Hynes, mayor of Boston, for legislation relative to the basis of admission of cities and towns into the north and south metropolitan sewerage districts, so much of the recommendations of the Metropolitan District Commission (House, No. 57) as relates to providing additional funds to cover the cost of certain sewerage projects and works within the north and south metropolitan sewerage districts (accompanied by bill, House, No. 59), the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 693) of Charles W. Greenough that additional funds be provided to cover the cost of certain sewerage works within the north metropolitan sewerage district, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1367) of J. Stanley Holt and others that the Metropolitan District Commission be directed to supply the town of Holden with water, report the accompanying resolve (House, No. 2537).

RESOLVE INCREASING THE SCOPE OF THE INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY THE SPECIAL COMMISSION ESTABLISHED TO MAKE AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY RELATIVE TO THE SYSTEMS OF SEWERAGE AND SEWAGE DISPOSAL IN THE NORTH AND SOUTH METROPOLITAN SEWERAGE DISTRICTS AND IN THE CITY OF BOSTON, AND THE METROPOLITAN WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM.

1 *Resolved*, That the unpaid special commission established  
2 by chapter one hundred and twenty-nine of the resolves of nine-  
3 teen hundred and fifty-six, and most recently revived and con-  
4 tinued by chapter one hundred and forty-four of the resolves of  
5 nineteen hundred and fifty-seven, shall, in making its investiga-  
6 tion and study, consider the subject matter of current senate  
7 document numbered 409, relative to the basis of admission of  
8 cities and towns into the north and south metropolitan sewerage  
9 districts; of current house document numbered 59, relative to  
10 providing additional funds to cover the cost of certain sewerage  
11 projects and works within the north and south metropolitan  
12 sewerage districts; of current house document numbered 693,  
13 relative to providing additional funds to cover the cost of cer-  
14 tam sewerage works within the north metropolitan sewerage  
15 district; and of current house document numbered 1367, relative  
16 to the supplying of water by the metropolitan district commis-  
17 sion.
