

HOUSE No. 3147

By Mr. Thompson of Weymouth, petition of George H. Thompson, Herbert B. Hollis, Newland H. Holmes and William A. Connell, Jr., that the town of Weymouth be authorized to appropriate or to borrow, within the debt limit, a sum of money for drainage and improvement from Weymouth Back River to Whitman's Pond. Municipal Finance.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF WEYMOUTH TO APPROPRIATE OR BORROW A SUM OF MONEY FOR THE PURPOSE OF DRAINAGE AND STREAM IMPROVEMENT FROM WEYMOUTH BACK RIVER TO WHITMAN'S POND.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The town of Weymouth is hereby authorized to
2 raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds a sum
3 not exceeding one hundred and ten thousand, five hundred dol-
4 lars for the purpose of drainage and stream improvement from
5 Weymouth Back river to Whitman's pond, according to plans
6 and specifications submitted by the firm of Metcalf and Eddy,
7 Engineers, in a report to the Weymouth Drainage Committee
8 dated March eleventh, nineteen hundred and fifty-seven, said
9 sum to be expended in conjunction with any money which may
10 be allotted for said purposes by the commonwealth under the
11 provisions of chapter ninety-one of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. For the purpose of providing funds for the ex-
2 penditures authorized by section one, the town of Weymouth
3 may, by the issuance of bonds or notes, borrow such sums as
4 may be necessary, not exceeding one hundred thousand dollars,
5 payable in not more than ten years. Said bonds or notes shall

6 bear on their face the words "Town of Weymouth Drainage
7 and Stream Improvement Loan Act of 1958." Each author-
8 ized issue shall constitute a separate loan. Indebtedness in-
9 curred under this act shall be within the statutory limit and
10 shall be subject to the provisions of chapter forty-four of the
11 General Laws, exclusive of the limitation contained in the first
12 paragraph of section seven thereof.

1 SECTION 3. Any action taken pursuant to the authority con-
2 tained in this act by the town of Weymouth at the annual town
3 meeting held in said town on March third and fifth, nineteen
4 hundred and fifty-eight, shall be valid and effective for all pur-
5 poses as though this act were in effect at the time of the posting
6 of the warrant for said meeting.

1 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
