RESOLUTIONS MEMORIALIZING THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES TO ENACT LEGISLATION CONFERRING CERTAIN RIGHTS AND PRIVILEGES UPON THOSE IN THE SERVICE OF THE ARMED FORCES.

- 1 *Resolved*, That the general court of Massachusetts respect-  
2 fully urges the Congress of the United States to enact such  
3 legislation as may be necessary to confer upon those now enter-  
4 ing the service of the armed forces rights and privileges similar  
5 to those conferred upon members of the armed forces during  
6 World War II and the Korean Emergency, under the G. I. Bill  
7 of Rights, so called; and be it further  
8 *Resolved*, That the secretary of the commonwealth transmit  
9 forthwith copies of these resolutions to the presiding officer of  
10 each branch of the Congress of the United States, and to each  
11 member thereof from this commonwealth.
