To accompany the petition of A. Frank Foster that provision be made for the establishment of two new divisions in the Metropolitan District Police force. Metropolitan Affairs.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT ESTABLISHING TWO NEW DIVISIONS IN THE METROPOLITAN
DISTRICT POLICE FORCE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 There shall be in the metropolitan district police force a new
2 police division, which shall comprise the West Roxbury district
3 and the Dorchester district in the city of Boston, and Franklin
4 Park, and a traffic division. Each of said divisions shall be
5 under the direction of a captain of the metropolitan district
6 police.

It is the duty of the Senate to advise and consent to the appointment and removal of officers of the Executive branch of the Government.

The Constitution of the United States

Article II, Section 2, Clause 2

The President shall have the right to nominate and to receive, and to appoint and to remove, judges of the Supreme and inferior Courts, and all other officers, and all other civil officers of the United States, who shall hold their offices during the term of years for which they are appointed, but which shall not exceed ten years unless they be appointed to fill a vacancy which may happen during their term; provided, that no appointment shall be made for a longer term than the remainder of the term for which the predecessor shall have been appointed: And the Congress may, by law, provide for the removal of any Judge or other civil officer who may be incompetent to discharge the duties of his office: And the Congress may, by law, provide for the removal of any Judge or other civil officer who may be incompetent to discharge the duties of his office.
