AN ACT REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC UTILITIES TO HOLD HEARINGS ON THE QUESTION OF ABOLITION OF THE GRADE CROSSING AT MOODY AND CARTER STREETS IN THE CITY OF WALTHAM.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding any contrary provision of section sixty-five  
2 of chapter one hundred and fifty-nine of the General Laws the  
3 department of public utilities shall place the grade crossing over  
4 the Boston and Maine Railway at Moody and Carter streets in  
5 the city of Waltham upon its lists for abolition and shall proceed  
6 as soon as may be to hold public hearings thereon in accordance  
7 with said section sixty-five and take action thereon in accord-  
8 ance with the provisions of sections sixty-five to eighty-two,  
9 inclusive, of said chapter one hundred and fifty-nine.

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

in the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Six

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE DEPARTMENT OF THE TREASURY AND THE RECEIPTS OF THE COMMONWEALTH, AND TO AMEND AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE DEPARTMENT OF THE TREASURY AND THE RECEIPTS OF THE COMMONWEALTH, PASSED IN THE YEAR ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Conference on the Thirtieth day of March, A. D. 1926.

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any contrary provision in section six of chapter one hundred and thirteen of the General Laws, the Department of Public Utilities shall place the gas meters at the Boston and Salem Railway at Salem and Essex streets in the city of Waltham upon its line for which it has been authorized to be constructed, as may be to hold public hearings thereon in accordance with and upon notice and fact upon chapter one hundred and thirteen of the General Laws, and the provisions of said chapter shall apply to the construction of said meters and fittings.
