AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF BOSTON TO MAINTAIN ON MOON ISLAND IN BOSTON HARBOR A TARGET PRACTICE RANGE AND A TRAINING SCHOOL FOR ITS POLICE OFFICERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The city of Boston is hereby authorized to maintain on
2 Moon island, in Boston harbor a target practice range for its
3 police officers, and, whenever land on said island shall be avail-
4 able, to establish, develop and maintain thereon a school for
5 the training of such officers in the techniques of police work;
6 and for such purposes said island shall be deemed to be within
7 the limits of said city within the meaning of section fifteen A
8 of chapter forty of the General Laws.
