AN ACT EXTENDING THE HISTORIC BEACON HILL DISTRICT IN THE CITY OF BOSTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 616 of the acts of 1955 is hereby amended
2 by inserting after section 1 the following section: — *Section 1A.*
3 The Historic Beacon Hill District created by section one is
4 hereby enlarged and extended to include an area contiguous
5 thereto, bounded as follows: — southerly by Byron street; west-
6 erly by Brimmer street; southerly again by Beaver place;
7 westerly again by Embankment road; northerly by Pinckney
8 street; and easterly by a line parallel with, and eighty feet
9 distant westerly from, the westerly line of Charles street.

1 SECTION 2. Nothing in this act shall be construed to prevent
2 or affect the construction, reconstruction, alteration or demoli-
3 tion of any structure within the area defined in section one
4 under a permit issued prior to the effective date of this act by
5 the building commissioner of the city of Boston whether or not
6 an exterior architectural feature is involved.
