RESOLUTIONS ON THE DEATH OF PAUL A. DEVER.

Whereas, The Massachusetts Senate has learned with deep regret of the death of former Governor of the Commonwealth Paul A. Dever. Three times elected as a member of the House of Representatives, three times elected as attorney-general and twice elected to the office of Governor, he earned an enviable reputation as a public servant. He was an able and brilliant legislator, a militant and courageous attorney-general, and as Governor of the Commonwealth he won the respect of its citizens by reason of his devotion to duty, his humanitarian zeal in insisting upon adequate care and treatment for those in poor health, his foresight and his steadfastness of purpose; therefore be it

Resolved, That the Massachusetts Senate expresses its deep sorrow at the death of Paul A. Dever, a loss which will be sorely felt by the citizens of Massachusetts, and extends its deepest sympathy to his bereaved family in their great loss; and be it further

Resolved, That these resolutions be spread upon the records of the Senate and that an engrossed copy thereof be transmitted by the Clerk of the Senate to the family of the deceased.
