SENATE, July 15, 1958.

The committee on Ways and Means, to whom was referred the Senate Bill to provide for assignment of counsel for indigent criminal defendants and payment of expenses and services of such counsel (Senate, No. 28, changed); the Senate Bill relative to the salaries of the members of the Board of Registration of Hairdressing (Senate, No. 59); the Senate Bill establishing the Massachusetts Recreation Board (Senate, No. 64); the Senate Bill extending the benefits of the law providing for contributory group general or blanket insurance for persons in the service of the Commonwealth and relating to the payment of certain premiums on such insurance (Senate, No. 178); the Senate Bill relative to instruction of certain physically handicapped children between the ages of three and six years (Senate, No. 286); the Senate Bill requiring public schools to use milk produced within the Commonwealth and empowering the Commissioner of Agriculture to enforce the law requiring said schools and certain institutions to use such milk (Senate, No. 288, amended); the Senate Bill authorizing and directing the Department of Public Works to lay out, alter, construct and maintain Thompson Road in the town of Douglas from Wallam Lake Road to the Connecticut State line (Senate, No. 320); the Senate Bill to provide for increased amounts of group life insurance for State employees at their option and to provide for the optional inclusion, at the employees' expense, of life insurance on a spouse (Senate, No. 345); the Senate Bill providing for the construction of a State Police substation to replace existing facilities in the town of Charlton (Senate, No. 463); the Senate Bill relative to the salary classification of certain employees in the Suffolk Registry of Probate (Senate, No. 473); the Senate Bill increasing the weekly subsidy payable by the Commonwealth to a municipality placing in a tuberculosis hospital or ward a person having a legal settlement in such municipality who is suffering from

tuberculosis (Senate, No. 484, changed); the Senate Bill enabling the city of Boston to convey to the Commonwealth without consideration a site for the reconstruction of a certain landmark (Senate, No. 559); the Senate Resolve to provide for the immediate inquiry by the joint committee on Ways and Means into the matter of the inadequacy of the salaries of attendant nurses as compared with others in the nursing services in the institution service and of instructors and other persons in the correctional service having care and custody of prisoners as compared with correction officers, and for a report as to the manner of adjusting the existing disproportion in salary grades (Senate, No. 470); the House Bill providing tenure for certain employees of the State Housing Board (House, No. 43); the House Bill authorizing the exclusion of amounts paid veterans for partial disability in computing the net income of tenants in certain housing projects (House, No. 304); the House Bill providing for the issuance of a sporting, hunting, fishing or trapping license to paraplegics without payment of a fee (House, No. 488); the House Bill relative to control of air pollution in the city of Boston and vicinity (House, No. 1503, amended); the House Bill providing for the construction by the Department of Public Works of such improvements, overpasses, underpasses, roadways or other related vehicular traffic facilities as may be necessary to relieve traffic congestion in the Watertown Square area of the town of Watertown (House, No. 1618); the House Bill providing for the abolition by the Department of Public Works of the grade crossings over the locations of the Boston and Maine Railroad at Moody and Elm streets in the city of Waltham (House, No. 1793); the House Bill requiring cities and towns to provide transportation for certain handicapped children (House, No. 1862); the House Bill creating the Massachusetts vacation and resort commission within the Department of Commerce and providing for advertising the vacation and resort attractions of the Commonwealth (House, No. 2130); the House Bill exempting from taxation certain real property of certain widows of World War I veterans (House, No. 2150); the House Bill to authorize fingerprinting of certain persons (House, No. 2840, amended); the House Bill creating an advisory board of trustees of the Lemuel Shattuck Hospital (House, No. 2972); the House Resolve providing for an investigation and study by an unpaid special commission relative to guarantees made in connection

with the sale at retail of automobile accessories (House, No. 2006, amended); the House Resolve providing for an investigation and study by a special committee relative to federal-state relations (House, No. 2890); and the House Order relative to authorizing the committee on Counties to sit during the recess of the General Court to investigate the construction of a new jail and sheriff's accommodations for Worcester County (see House, No. 2796), report the accompanying Order (see Senate, No. 773).
