AN ACT INCREASING THE SALARIES OF THE MEMBERS AND THE SECRETARY OF THE LICENSING BOARD FOR THE CITY OF BOSTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 291 of the acts of 1906 is hereby amended
2 by striking out section 2, as most recently amended by section 1
3 of chapter 62 of the acts of 1955, and inserting in place thereof
4 the following section:— *Section 2.* The annual salary of the
5 chairman of said board shall be nine thousand seven hundred
6 and fifty dollars, that of each of the other two members nine
7 thousand two hundred and fifty dollars and that of the secretary
8 nine thousand dollars. Such salaries shall be paid in monthly
9 instalments by the city of Boston. Subject to the approval of
10 the governor and council, said board may provide itself with
11 rooms, convenient and suitable for the performance of its duties,
12 the rent of which shall be paid by the city of Boston. Said rooms
13 shall be suitably furnished and equipped, and the expense thereof
14 shall be paid by said city upon requisition by said board.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
