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## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Eight.

AN ACT REGULATING THE CONVEYANCE OF LAND ACQUIRED BY EMINENT DOMAIN BY ONE CITY OR TOWN WITHIN THE LIMITS OF ANOTHER CITY OR TOWN.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 15 of chapter 40 of the General Laws, as appearing  
2 in the Tercentenary Edition, is hereby amended by adding at  
3 the end the following paragraph: — No land heretofore or here-  
4 after acquired by eminent domain by one city or town within  
5 the limits of another city or town shall be conveyed under this  
6 section unless the mayor or selectmen authorized to convey such  
7 land offer to convey such land to the city or town wherein such  
8 land lies for the minimum amount specified as aforesaid, nor  
9 unless such offer is not accepted within six months after notice  
10 thereof is given to the mayor or selectmen of the city or town  
11 wherein such land lies by the mayor or selectmen authorized  
12 to convey, nor unless such conveyance is made within three  
13 months after the expiration of said six months. Land so offered  
14 to a city or town wherein it lies may be purchased by such city  
15 or town whether or not needed for the municipal purposes of  
16 such city or town, and, if so purchased and if such land is not  
17 needed for municipal purposes, it shall be disposed of as such  
18 city or town shall determine.
