AN ACT CLASSIFYING CERTAIN HANDICAPPED CHILDREN OF EMPLOYEES INSURED UNDER THE STATE INSURANCE PLAN AS DEPENDENTS AND FURTHER PROVIDING THAT THE COMMONWEALTH SHARE IN ANY ADDITIONAL PREMIUM REQUIRED.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Paragraph (d) of section 2 of chapter 32A, as
2 appearing in chapter 628 of the acts of 1955, is hereby amended
3 by adding after the word "age" in line 2 the following: —, and
4 handicapped children of the employee as defined in paragraph
5 (d) of section 6 of chapter 176B.

1 SECTION 2. Paragraph (a) of section 8 of said chapter 32A,
2 as so appearing, is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof
3 the following sentence: — The commonwealth shall also con-
4 tribute fifty per cent of any additional premium which may be
5 required for coverage of the employee's handicapped children
6 classified as dependents.
