*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 44 of chapter 71 of the General Laws is hereby amended  
2 by adding at the end thereof the following sentence:— No  
3 teacher or other public school employee shall suffer a deduction  
4 from salary on account of absence from duty to appear as a  
5 court witness.
