AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE PAYMENT OF SPECIFIC COMPENSATION  
UNDER THE WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION LAW PAYABLE TO THE  
EMPLOYEE IN A BULK SUM.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 36 of chapter 152 of the General Laws, as most re-  
2 cently amended by chapter 64 of the acts of 1953, is hereby  
3 further amended by inserting in place of the word "may" ap-  
4 pearing in the first sentence of the last paragraph of said section,  
5 the word: — shall, — so that said sentence as amended will read  
6 as follows: — The weekly payments provided for in this section  
7 shall at the discretion of the board or any member thereof be  
8 paid to the employee in a bulk sum.
