

HOUSE No. 1834

By Messrs. Kennedy of Everett and Finnegan of Everett (by request), petition of John P. Welsh and others for the removal of certain persons who refuse appointment under the civil service laws as permanent full-time junior building custodians in the school department of the city of Everett. Civil Service.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE REMOVAL OF CERTAIN PERSONS REFUSING APPOINTMENT AS PERMANENT FULL-TIME JUNIOR BUILDING CUSTODIANS IN THE SCHOOL DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF EVERETT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any provisions of law to the
2 contrary, any permanent intermittent junior building custodian
3 in the school department of the city of Everett, except one
4 serving in the military or naval service at the time of civil service
5 certification, who refuses to accept appointment as a permanent
6 full time junior building custodian in said school department on
7 the occasion of three separate certifications after July first,
8 nineteen hundred and fifty-nine shall be ineligible for further
9 certification, and shall thereupon cease to be a permanent inter-
10 mittent junior building custodian. The appointing officer shall
11 forward to the director a notification of the termination of the
12 service of such permanent intermittent junior building custodian,
13 setting forth the occasion of each refusal and the date upon which
14 the services of such permanent intermittent junior building cus-
15 todian ceased.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its acceptance by
2 the city council and the school committee of the city of Everett,
3 subject to the provisions of its charter, but not otherwise.

The Commissioners of the Land Office

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty-Six

That the said Commissioners do hereby certify that the following is a true and correct copy of the act in relation to the sale of land in the State of Illinois, approved March 27, 1834.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the following be and they are hereby enacted into law.

Section 1. That the said Commissioners of the Land Office be and they are hereby authorized to sell the land in the State of Illinois, in such parcels as may be offered for sale, and to receive the proceeds of such sales, and to deposit the same in the Treasury of the United States, to be paid to the owners of such land, or to the persons entitled to the same, as may be directed by the said Commissioners.

Section 2. That the said Commissioners be and they are hereby authorized to make such regulations as may be necessary for the carrying into effect of the provisions of this act.
