AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE SALARIES OF CERTAIN ASSISTANT DISTRICT ATTORNEYS FOR THE SUFFOLK DISTRICT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 16 of chapter 12 of the General Laws, as most re-
2 cently amended by section 2 of chapter 185 of the acts of 1957, is
3 hereby further amended by striking out the second paragraph
4 and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:—

5 For the Suffolk district, one assistant, nine thousand nine
6 hundred dollars, to be designated as head of the homicide
7 division; two assistants, nine thousand seven hundred dollars;
8 four assistants, seven thousand seven hundred dollars; two as-
9 sistants, six thousand six hundred dollars; **and fifteen [five]**
10 assistants, six thousand dollars [; and ten assistants, five
11 thousand dollars].
