AN ACT PROVIDING FOR REIMBURSEMENT TO CERTAIN CITIES,
TOWNS AND SCHOOL DISTRICTS FOR EXCESS COMPENSATION PAID
TO CERTAIN TEACHERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 69 of the General Laws is hereby amended by insert-
- 2 ing after section 28A, the following section:—
- 3 *Section 28B.* The department may, in co-operation with the
- 4 school committee, establish in cities, towns and school districts
- 5 having ten or more blind or partially blind children resident
- 6 therein or accessible thereto, special day classes for such children.
- 7 Such classes when established, shall be conducted by the school
- 8 committee, subject to the approval of the department. That
- 9 portion of the compensation of teachers of such special classes,
- 10 whenever certified by the commissioner as having been in excess
- 11 of regular compensation paid to its teachers, shall be reim-
- 12 bursed to such cities, towns and school districts by the state
- 13 treasurer.
