MEMORANDUM OF COMMISSIONER OF CORPORATIONS AND TAXATION PURSUANT TO GENERAL LAWS, CHAPTER 3, SECTION 7, WITH RESPECT TO PETITION OF PAUL GONSALVES AND OTHERS RELATIVE TO THE PAYMENT BY THE FALL RIVER POLICE RELIEF ASSOCIATION OF SUMS OF MONEY TO RETIRED MEMBERS OF THE ASSOCIATION AND AUTHORIZING THE PAYMENT OF CERTAIN DEATH BENEFITS.

DECEMBER 29, 1958.

To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives.

The above-named petition was transmitted to me by the Clerk of the House of Representatives on December 19, 1958, with a request for a memorandum.

The above-named corporation, Fall River Police Relief Association, was organized January 12, 1917, in pursuance of the provisions of chapter 628 of the acts of 1911, which act is entitled, "An Act to provide for the control and regulation of Fraternal Benefit Societies."

The bill before your honorable bodies seeks to authorize the said corporation to pay any member in good standing, upon his retirement, a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars as may be determined by vote of the directors of the said corporation. It seeks further to authorize the payment to a member upon the death of his wife a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars as said board of directors may determine and further to pay, upon the death of a member, a death benefit in a sum not exceeding five thousand dollars, as said board may determine. Special legislation is required to effect the desired results.

No fee is payable by a corporation of the type described in the petition and its accompanying bill.

It is respectfully suggested that inasmuch as the subject corporation is under the supervision of the Insurance Commissioner that an opinion on the merits of the bill be obtained from him.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE PAYMENT BY THE FALL RIVER POLICE RELIEF ASSOCIATION OF SUMS OF MONEY TO RETIRED MEMBERS OF THE ASSOCIATION AND AUTHORIZING THE PAYMENT OF CERTAIN DEATH BENEFITS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The Fall River Police Relief Association, a corporation duly
2 established under the laws of the commonwealth, is hereby
3 authorized, upon the retirement of any member in good stand-
4 ing, to pay such member such sum, not exceeding five hundred
5 dollars, as may be determined by vote of the directors of the
6 corporation. Said association is hereby further authorized to
7 pay to a member upon the death of his wife such sum, not ex-
8 ceeding five hundred dollars, as said board of directors may
9 so determine, and upon the death of a member to pay a death
10 benefit in such sum, not exceeding five thousand dollars, as
11 may be so determined by said board.
