RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION BY THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL RELATIVE TO THE ADMISSIBILITY IN EVIDENCE IN CASES OF TORT FOR PERSONAL INJURIES, OF CERTAIN PRINTS SHOWING PARTS OF THE HUMAN ANATOMY, SKELETONS OR PARTS THEREOF AND PLASTER REPRODUCTIONS OF BONE STRUCTURE.

1 *Resolved*, That the judicial council be requested to investigate
2 the subject matter of current house document numbered 703,
3 relative to the admissibility in evidence in cases of tort for per-
4 sonal injuries, of certain prints showing parts of the human
5 anatomy, skeletons or parts thereof and plaster reproductions
6 of bone structure, and to include its conclusions and its recom-
7 mendations, if any, in relation thereto, together with drafts of
8 such legislation as may be necessary to give effect to the same,
9 in its annual report for the current year.
