**Chap. 237**

Any person who has taken the Canadian Nurses Association Testing Service Comprehensive Exam in French in August of nineteen hundred and eighty or thereafter and achieved a comprehensive score of greater than four hundred and has been registered by a province of Canada in which an examination was taken and meets the eligibility requirements of clinical and theoretical study as determined by the board, and has attained a score of at least five hundred and fifty on the English Proficiency Examination and furnishes to the board satisfactory proof of good moral character and having graduated from a school of nursing approved by the board of nursing in the jurisdiction in which the applicant was originally registered shall be deemed to have met standards substantially the same as those of the commonwealth for the licensing of nurses and shall be licensed in the commonwealth without examination.

**Chapter 238. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF WORCESTER TO UTILIZE  
A CERTAIN PARCEL OF LAND FOR STREET PURPOSES.**

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

The city of Worcester is hereby authorized to utilize a certain parcel of land, acquired for water supply purposes, shown as parcel 17-C on a plan recorded in the Worcester district registry of deeds in Book 670 as Plan 22 for the purpose of realigning the location of Plantation street, a public highway in said city.

**Chapter 239. AN ACT REDUCING REPORTING REQUIREMENTS OF CERTAIN  
CANDIDATES.**

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Section 19 of chapter 55 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 1992 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out subsection (e) and inserting in place thereof the following subsection:-

(e) The cashier or treasurer of the bank, selected by any candidate or committee as above provided, shall file with the director (1) during the last six months of an election year by the fifth day and twentieth day of each month while such account is in existence, and (2) during the first six months of an election year and during non-election years by the fifth day of each month while such account is in existence and has received deposits greater than two hundred and fifty dollars or made withdrawals greater than two hundred and fifty dollars during the preceding month but in any case no less than semiannually on the fifth day of

January and July while such account is in existence, the following information, a statement of the balance as of the preceding first day or fifteenth day of the month or as of the last report filed pursuant to this paragraph, whichever is applicable, together with a summary of all of the deposit slips presented to the bank since the last such statement with any deposit of monies to the campaign account of such candidate or committee, listing the names alphabetically and other data as to all donors as it appeared on the deposit slip, and a list of all the checks presented to the bank since the last such statement upon which any funds were withdrawn from any such account with the names and addresses of the payees and the amount of each check, and the purposes for which the money was paid as thereon indicated. For the purposes of this subsection, the term "election year" shall mean the calendar year in which a primary, special or general election is scheduled for the office sought or held by the candidate or political committee maintaining such account and the term "non-election year" shall mean all other years.

**Chapter 240. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF SUNDERLAND TO SELL CERTAIN LAND TO THE COMMONWEALTH.**

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

The town of Sunderland is hereby authorized to sell and convey to the commonwealth through its division of capital planning and operations, acting on behalf of the department of fisheries, wildlife and environmental law enforcement, certain parcels of land located in said town and currently used for conservation purposes. Said parcels are described as follows:

Parcel One - A certain tract of land lying in the Connecticut River and known as the Great Island, containing six acres of land more or less. Being the same premises as described in a deed recorded in the Franklin county registry of deeds, Book 1666, Page 55;

Parcel Two - A certain tract of land lying in the Connecticut River and known as First Island, being the first island located north of the Sunderland bridge, containing three acres of land more or less. Being the same premises as described in a deed recorded at the Franklin county registry of deeds, Book 1685, Page 202.

**Chapter 241. AN ACT DESIGNATING A PORTION OF STATE HIGHWAY ROUTE 9 IN THE TOWN OF SHREWSBURY AS THE POLICE OFFICER JAMES LONCHLADIS MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.**

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

That portion of state highway Route 9 within the town of Shrewsbury shall be des-
