AN ACT PERMITTING THE POSSESSION OF AND THE HUNTING OR TRAPPING OF CERTAIN MAMMALS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 6 of chapter 131 of the General Laws, as most recently
2 amended by section 1 of chapter 482 of the acts of 1953, is hereby
3 further amended by striking out the first paragraph and inserting
4 in place thereof the following paragraph:—

5 No person, except as otherwise provided in this chapter, shall
6 hunt or trap or have in his possession, the living or dead bodies
7 of mammals, except chipmunks, foxes, flying squirrels, red
8 squirrels, porcupines, rodents, skunks, weasels or woodchucks.
