RESOLVE VALIDATING THE ACTS OF MARY A. GALVIN AS A NOTARY PUBLIC.

1 *Resolved*, That the acts of Mary A. Galvin of Worcester as a
2 notary public between February eighth, nineteen hundred and
3 forty-seven and September twentieth, nineteen hundred and
4 fifty, both dates inclusive, insofar as the same may have been
5 invalid by reason of the fact that, upon the change of her name
6 from Mary A. Sheehan, she failed to re-register under her new
7 name and pay to the state secretary a fee of one dollar as
8 required by section thirteen of chapter thirty of the General
9 Laws, are hereby confirmed and made valid.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES
IN THE YEAR OF THE LORD ONE THOUSAND AND SEVENTEEN

ARTICLE I
SECTION 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.
The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
No Person shall be a Representative who shall not have attained to the Age of twenty five Years, seven Years shall have passed upon him, and when elected he shall have been seven Years a Citizen of the United States, and when he shall be elected he shall have been seven Years a Citizen of the State in which he shall be elected, and he shall, when elected, be an Inhabitant of that State in which he shall be elected.
Representatives and electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
The Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
The House of Representatives shall choose their Speaker and other Officers, and shall have the sole Power of Impeachment.
