The committee on Ways and Means, to whom was referred the Order relative to the appointment of a joint special committee to make an investigation relative to the reopening of runway 22-L at the General Edward Lawrence Logan International Airport (House, No. 3055), report that the same ought to be adopted.

Ordered, That a special committee, consisting of two members of the Senate to be designated by the President thereof and three members of the House of Representatives to be designated by the Speaker thereof, is hereby established for the purpose of making an investigation relative to the reopening of runway 22-L at the General Edward Lawrence Logan International Airport, after said runway had been closed, with a view to determining the necessity of reopening said runway.

Said committee shall be provided with quarters in the State House or elsewhere, may hold public hearings, may travel within and without the Commonwealth, shall have the power to summon witnesses and to require the production of books, records and papers, and the giving of testimony under oath, and may expend for expert, technical, legal, clerical and other services and expenses such sums as may be appropriated therefor.

Said committee shall report the results of its investigation, and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry said recommendations into effect by filing the same with the Clerk of the House of Representatives on or before the first day of September, nineteen hundred and fifty-nine.
