RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE INSTALLATION OF PLUMBING IN OR ADJACENT TO BUILDINGS.

1 RESOLVED, That an unpaid special commission, to consist of
2 one member of the Senate to be designated by the President
3 thereof, one member of the House of Representatives to be
4 designated by the Speaker thereof, the President of the New
5 England Plumbing Inspectors Association if he be a resident
6 of Massachusetts otherwise a Massachusetts resident designee
7 of said President, the President of the Massachusetts State
8 Association of Master Plumbers, the immediate Past Presi-
9 dent of the Massachusetts State Association of Master Plumb-
10 ers, the journeyman member of the Board of Plumber Exam-
11 iners of the Commonwealth, and a labor member to be desig-
12 nated by the President of the Massachusetts State Association
13 of Journeyman Plumbers and Pipefitters, is hereby established
14 to make an investigation and study of the Provisions of Chap-
15 ter 142 of the General Laws, and the State Regulations rela-
16 tive to public regulation of the installation of Plumbing in and
17 adjacent to buildings. Said commission shall report to the
18 general court the results of its study and investigation by fil-
19 ing the same, together with such drafts of legislation as it may
20 deem necessary or appropriate, with the clerk of the house of
21 representatives not later than the first Wednesday of Decem-
22 ber, nineteen hundred and fifty-nine.
