AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE COMMONWEALTH TO REINSTATE MARTIN KILLILEA FOR THE SOLE PURPOSE OF RETIREMENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Any provision of law to the contrary notwithstanding,
2 the Commonwealth of Massachusetts shall reinstate
3 Martin Killilea, as an employee of the Alcoholic Beverages
4 Control Commission for the sole purpose of retirement and in
5 order to correct a mistake made at the time of his original
6 retirement. Upon such reinstatement, said Martin Killilea
7 shall be allowed to apply for retirement under the provisions
8 of Section 57 of Chapter 32 of the General Laws, and his ap-
9 plication shall be processed on the same basis as if it had been
10 filed prior to the date of his original retirement.
