EXECUTIVE OFFICE OF ENVIRONMENTAL AFFAIRS.

Department of Environmental Management.

2100-8941 For planning, design, and construction of improvements to the state park located in the town of Plymouth, known as the pilgrim memorial state park and Plymouth rock; provided, that no funds shall be spent for capital improvements in the town of Plymouth without the approval of the board of selectmen \$2,500,000

Metropolitan District Commission.

2440-8941 For repairs and improvements to the rink located in the city of Lynn, known as the Connery Memorial rink, operated by the metropolitan district commission \$1,000,000

2440-8942 For repairs and improvements to the rink located in the Charlestown section of the city of Boston, known as the Emmons-Horrigan-O'Neil Memorial rink, operated by the metropolitan district commission \$400,000

Department of Social Services.

the commissioner of the department of social services files a spending plan with the office of management information systems, the state budget director and the house and senate committees on ways and means detailing the equipment and software to be purchased \$2,500,000

EXECUTIVE OFFICE OF PUBLIC SAFETY.

Department of Public Safety.

8311-8941 For computer equipment and associated software required to record, store, and report on firearms records, including firearms identification cards, gun sales records and licenses to carry, provided, that no funds shall be expended from this item until the commissioner of the department of public safety files a spending plan with the office of management information systems, the state budget director and the house and senate committees on ways and means detailing the equipment and software to be purchased \$115,000

SECTION 3. To meet the expenditures necessary in carrying out the provisions of section two, the state treasurer shall, upon the request of the governor, issue and sell bonds of the commonwealth, in an amount specified by the governor from time to time, not exceeding, in the aggregate, thirty million six hundred forty-one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four dollars. All bonds issued by the commonwealth, as aforesaid, shall be designated on their face, Emergency Capital Outlay Loan Act of 1993, and shall be issued for such maximum term, not exceeding twenty years, as the governor may recommend to the general court pursuant to section 3 of Article LXII of the Amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth; provided, that all such bonds shall be payable not later than June thirtieth, two thousand and nineteen. All interest and payments on account of principal of such obligations shall be payable from the Local Aid Fund. Bonds and interest thereon issued under the authority of this section shall be general obligations of the commonwealth.

SECTION 4. To meet the expenditures necessary in carrying out the provisions of section two A of this act, the state treasurer shall, upon the request of the governor, issue and sell bonds of the commonwealth in an amount to be specified by the governor from time to time, not exceeding, in the aggregate, forty-seven million six hundred fifteen thousand dollars. All bonds issued by the commonwealth, as aforesaid, shall be designated on their face, Computer System Technology Loan Act of 1993, and shall be issued for such maximum term of years, not exceeding ten years, as the governor may recommend to the general court pursuant to section 3 of Article LXII of the Amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth; provided, that all such bonds shall be payable not later than June thirtieth, two thousand and nine. All interest and payments on account of principal of such obligations resulting from expenditures authorized in item 0640-8940 in said section two A shall be payable from the Local Aid Fund. Bonds and interest thereon issued under the authority of this section shall be general obligations of the commonwealth.

SECTION 5. The state treasurer may borrow from time to time on the credit of the commonwealth such sums as may be necessary for the purpose of meeting payments authorized by sections two and two A and may issue and renew from time to time notes of the commonwealth therefor, bearing interest payable at such time and at such rates as shall be fixed by the state treasurer. Such notes shall be issued and may be renewed one or more times for such terms, not exceeding one year, as the governor may recommend to the general court in accordance with section 3 of Article LXII of the Amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth, but the final maturities of such notes, whether original or renewal, shall not be later than June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and ninety-nine. Notes and interest thereon issued under the authority of this section shall be general obligations of the commonwealth. All interest and payments on account of principal of such obligations shall be payable from the Local Aid Fund.

SECTION 6. Section 8B of chapter 212 of the acts of 1975, inserted by section 11 of chapter 130 of the acts of 1987, is hereby amended by striking out, in line 5, the word "seven" and inserting in place thereof the following word:- twelve.

SECTION 7. The first paragraph of section 8E of said chapter 212, as appearing in section 239 of chapter 110 of the acts of 1993, is hereby amended by striking out, in line 6, the word "forty" and inserting in place thereof the following word:- fifty.

SECTION 8. Section 17 of chapter 564 of the acts of 1987 is hereby amended by striking out, in line 5, the word "rehabilitation" and inserting in place thereof the following words:- relocation, rehabilitation.

SECTION 9. Said section 17 of said chapter 564 is hereby further amended by striking out, in lines 6 to 8, inclusive, the words "any and all grants shall be matched with a fifty percent cash or in-kind grant for the costs of such projects from federal, local or private" and inserting in place thereof the following words:- five hundred thousand dollars each shall be expended for the relocation of Highland Lighthouse in the town of Truro and Nauset Lighthouse in the town of Eastham; provided, further, that any and all grants shall be matched by federal, local or other.

SECTION 10. Said section 17 of said chapter 564 is hereby further amended by striking out, in lines 9 and 10, the words "than any municipality receiving a grant from funds appropriated herein shall, as a condition of" and inserting in place thereof the following words:- that any grantee shall, as a condition of receiving.

SECTION 11. Section 8 of chapter 33 of the acts of 1991 is hereby amended by inserting after the word "limit", in line 3, the following words:- , for each fiscal year commencing on and after July first, nineteen hundred and ninety-four,.

SECTION 12. Section 13 of said chapter 33 is hereby amended by striking out, in line 16, the word "nine" and inserting in place thereof the following word:- eight.

SECTION 13. Section 18 of said chapter 33 is hereby amended by inserting after the word "dollars", in line 7, the first time it appears, the following words:- issued in any fiscal year commencing on and after July first, nineteen hundred and ninety-four.

SECTION 14. Item 1101-8921 in section 2 of chapter 194 of the acts of 1992 is hereby amended by inserting after the word "so-called", in line 9, the following words:- ; provided, further, that not less than one million four hundred thousand dollars shall be available for expenditure in fiscal year nineteen hundred and ninety-four and not less than one million two hundred seventy thousand dollars shall be available for expenditure in fiscal year nineteen hundred and ninety-five.

SECTION 15. Item 4000-8200 of section 2 of chapter 52 of the acts of 1993 is hereby amended by adding the following words:- ; provided, further, that the costs of professional personnel, excluding clerical and support personnel, directly and exclusively involved in the construction and planning and design of the projects funded herein may be charged to this item; provided, that said costs shall not be classified as administrative costs; provided further, that an amount not to exceed two percent of the amount authorized herein may be expended for the administrative costs directly attributable to the programs funded herein, including the costs of clerical and support personnel; and provided further, that the secretary of communities and development shall file an annual spending plan with the budget bureau and the house and senate committees on ways and means which details, by subsidiary, all personnel costs and administrative costs charged to this item.

SECTION 16. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other general or special law to the contrary, the secretary of the executive office of transportation and construction is hereby authorized and directed to provide to the towns of Dover and Needham, one hundred and sixty thousand dollars from existing appropriations or capital authorizations for the design and engineering costs necessary for the replacement of the Dover Road/Charles River street bridge, so-called.

Chapter 494. AN ACT PROVIDING FOR HOUSING PRESERVATION AND NEIGHBORHOOD DEVELOPMENT.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. To provide for a program of housing preservation and neighborhood development, there is hereby made available, for the several purposes and subject to the conditions specified under the provisions of this act, subject to the provisions of law regulating the disbursement of public funds and the approval thereof the amounts set forth in items 3722-8891, 3722-8892, 3722-8896, 3722-8898, 3722-8899, 3722-8900 of section two. To provide for a program of housing preservation and neighborhood development, there is hereby made available, subject to the provisions of law regulating the disbursement of public funds and the approval thereof, for the purposes and subject to the conditions and amount specified under the provisions of item 3722-8894 of section two, an amount not to exceed, in each year, six times the amount designated to be expended pursuant to item 3722-8900 in that year in a capital spending plan broken down by authorization item to be
