
To accompany the petition of Charles P. Murray and another for the regulation of games of skill at agricultural fairs. Agriculture.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Three.

AN ACT

To regulate Games of Skill at Agricultural Fairs held in this Commonwealth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Before any games of skill shall
2 be set up, operated or maintained either by a
3 principal or agent at any agricultural fair in this
4 commonwealth, the same shall be submitted to
5 the commissioner of public safety of this com-
6 monwealth who shall inspect, or cause to be in-
7 spected, and if approved a certificate shall be
8 given to the owner or operator of the game or
8 games who shall exhibit said certificate to the
10 president or secretary, or any other official desig-
11 nated by the fair management.

1 SECTION 2. Whoever violates any provision
2 of this act, or forges or counterfeits a certificate,
3 or has in his possession another's certificate with
4 intent to use the same, shall be punished by a fine
5 of not more than one hundred dollars.
