AN ACT

Relative to the Retirement Allowances of School Janitors in the City of Boston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section thirty of chapter five
2 hundred and twenty-one of the acts of nineteen
3 hundred and twenty-two is hereby amended by
4 inserting after the word "determine", in the
5 second line, the words: — for the purposes of this
6 act and all other retirement acts applicable to
7 school janitors in the city of Boston, — so as to
8 read as follows: — *Section 30.* The school com-
9 mittee of the city of Boston shall determine for
10 the purposes of this act and all other retirement
11 acts applicable to school janitors in the city of
12 Boston, the regular compensation paid school
13 janitors. Such regular compensation shall be
14 such part or the whole of the amount paid a school
15 janitor by the city of Boston under the method
16 now used in determining the cost of janitors'
17 services in the public school buildings as is
18 retained by a janitor for his own services as fixed
19 by the school committee.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon
2 its passage.
