The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-One.

Resolve providing for an Investigation by a Special Commission relative to the Laws of the Commonwealth pertaining to the Inspection of Dairy Farms producing Milk and Cream for Distribution in the Commonwealth.

1 *Resolved*, That a special unpaid commission,
2 to consist of one member of the senate to be
3 designated by the president, two members of the
4 house of representatives to be designated by the
5 speaker, and four persons to be appointed by
6 the governor, two of whom shall be milk in-
7 spectors and two of whom shall be milk producers
8 in the commonwealth, is hereby established for
9 the purpose of making a thorough study and
10 investigation relative to the enforcement and
11 adequacy of the laws relating to the inspection
12 of dairy farms producing milk and cream for
13 distribution in the commonwealth. Said com-
14 mission shall be provided with quarters in the
15 state house or elsewhere, may hold hearings, and
16 may expend for clerical and other services and
17 expenses such sums, not exceeding in the aggre-
18 gate two thousand dollars, as may hereafter be
19 appropriated. Said commission shall make a

20 report to the general court by filing its findings
21 and recommendations, with drafts of such legis-
22 lation as may be necessary to carry such recom-
23 mendations into effect, with the clerk of the
24 senate on or before the first Wednesday of
25 December in the current year.
