## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-One.

An Act penalizing the Requirement that Certain Women and Children work without Monetary Compensation in Certain Establishments.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter one hundred and forty-nine of the General  
2 Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section one  
3 hundred and fifty-eight the following new section: —  
4 *Section 158A.* Whoever requires or permits a  
5 woman or a minor, as a condition of securing employ-  
6 ment, to work in any factory, workshop, manufacturing,  
7 mechanical or mercantile establishment without mone-  
8 tary compensation shall be punished by a fine of not  
9 more than fifty dollars.
