An Act safeguarding the Rights of Persons in the Classified Civil Service in Respect to Separation therefrom.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter thirty-one of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by inserting after section forty-
3 six A, inserted by chapter two hundred and
4 forty-three of the acts of nineteen hundred and
5 thirty, the following new section: —

6 *Section 46B.* Upon receipt of notice from
7 an appointing officer or of other information
8 that a person in the classified civil service has
9 become separated therefrom through no fault
10 or delinquency of his own, the commissioner shall
11 forthwith give notice thereof to such person by
12 registered mail and shall set forth in said notice
13 the manner, means and methods whereby such
14 person may be reinstated therein or his civil
15 service status and rights preserved.
