

SENATE No. 134

To accompany the petition of Conde Brodbine that the installation of dial telephones, so called, in public pay stations be forbidden. Mercantile Affairs.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Two.

An Act forbidding Dial Telephones, so called, in Public Pay Stations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter one hundred and sixty-
2 six of the General Laws is hereby amended by
3 inserting after section fourteen the following new
4 section:—

5 *Section 14A.* No person owning, controlling
6 or operating a telephone exchange or service in
7 the commonwealth shall install, or permit or
8 suffer to remain, any dial telephone, so called,
9 in any public pay station owned or controlled
10 by him.

1 SECTION 2. Section fifteen of said chapter one
2 hundred and sixty-six is hereby amended by
3 striking out, in the second line, the word "two"
4 and inserting in place thereof the word:— three,

5 — so as to read as follows:— *Section 15.* The
6 supreme judicial or superior court shall have
7 jurisdiction in equity to enforce the three pre-
8 ceding sections.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect on June
2 first of the current year.
