

To accompany the petition of Frank D. McCarthy that the sale of wines and malt beverages under certain conditions be allowed at sporting events on Sundays. Legal Affairs.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Seven.

An Act permitting the Sale of Wines and Malt Beverages under Certain Conditions at Sporting Events on Sundays.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section twelve of chapter one hundred and thirty-
2 eight of the General Laws is hereby amended by
3 adding at the end of the second paragraph, as most
4 recently amended by section two of chapter three
5 hundred and sixty-eight of the acts of nineteen hun-
6 dred and thirty-six, the following:—; provided,
7 that any licensee under sections twenty-one to
8 twenty-five, inclusive, of chapter one hundred and
9 thirty-six, may be granted a license for the sale on
10 Sundays, for a period beginning one half hour before
11 and extending to one half hour after the period covered
12 by such license under said sections twenty-one to
13 twenty-five, inclusive, of wines and malt beverages
14 to be served without requiring the person so served
15 to be seated, — so that the said paragraph will read

16 as follows:— No alcoholic beverage shall on secular
17 days be served to or drunk by a woman as patron,
18 guest or member in a public room or area of a hotel,
19 or in a restaurant or club, licensed under this section,
20 except while seated at a table or seated at a counter
21 equipped with stools; and no such beverage shall on
22 Sundays be served to or drunk by any patron, guest
23 or member at a bar or counter in such a hotel, restau-
24 rant or club; provided, that any licensee under sec-
25 tions twenty-one to twenty-five, inclusive, of chapter
26 one hundred and thirty-six, may be granted a license
27 for the sale on Sundays, for a period beginning one
28 half hour before and extending to one half hour
29 after the period covered by such license under said
30 sections twenty-one to twenty-five, inclusive, of wines
31 and malt beverages to be served without requiring
32 the person so served to be seated.
