RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR A STUDY BY A SPECIAL UNPAID COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE BOSTON AIRPORT, SO CALLED.

1 *Resolved*, That a special unpaid commission, to
2 consist of one member of the senate to be designated
3 by the president thereof, two members of the house
4 of representatives to be designated by the speaker
5 thereof, and two persons to be appointed by the
6 governor, is hereby established for the purpose of
7 making a thorough investigation and study of the
8 Boston airport, so called. The commission shall hold
9 public hearings, shall be provided with quarters in
10 the state house or elsewhere, and may expend, with
11 the approval of the governor and council, for clerical
12 and other services and expenses, including travel
13 within and without the commonwealth, such sums,
14 not exceeding, in the aggregate, three thousand dol-
15 lars, as may hereafter be appropriated. The com-
16 mission shall report to the general court the results of
17 its investigation and its recommendations, if any,
18 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry
19 its recommendations into effect, by filing the same
20 with the clerk of the senate on or before the first
21 Wednesday in December in the current year.
