The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Nine.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD TO REIMBURSE THE WIDOW OF CARL ROLF FOR THE EXPENSES OF HIS FUNERAL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. For the purpose of discharging a moral
2 obligation, the city of Springfield may appropriate
3 and pay to the widow of Carl Rolf, who died Novem-
4 ber second, nineteen hundred and thirty-eight, as a
5 result of injuries sustained while in the performance
6 of his duty as a member of the police department of
7 said city, a sum not exceeding five hundred and sixty-
8 one dollars, in reimbursement only of the expenses of
9 his funeral.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take full effect upon its
2 acceptance, during the current year, by vote of the
3 city council of said city, subject to the provisions of
4 its charter, but not otherwise.
