

By Mr. Patrone of Boston, petition of Charles L. Patrone that veterans of the Korean war be exempt from furnishing certificates of public convenience and necessity for the operation of sight-seeing automobiles in the city of Boston. Transportation.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Three.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT VETERANS OF THE KOREAN WAR BE NOT REQUIRED TO FURNISH CERTIFICATES OF PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY FOR THE OPERATION OF SIGHT-SEEING AUTOMOBILES IN THE CITY OF BOSTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 399 of the acts of 1931 is hereby amended
2 by striking out section 2, as amended by section 1
3 of chapter 93 of the acts of 1933, and inserting in
4 place thereof the following section:—

5 *Section 2.* It shall be unlawful for a person or a
6 corporation to offer or furnish service by a sight-
7 seeing automobile in or from the city of Boston unless
8 said automobile is first licensed hereunder and, except
9 as otherwise provided in section five, unless thereafter
10 a certificate of public convenience and necessity is
11 obtained as hereinafter provided, and it shall be un-
12 lawful for a person to operate such an automobile
13 as driver in or from said city unless he is licensed so
14 to do as hereinafter provided.
