AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE GRADING OF CAPITOL POLICE IN THE GENERAL SALARY SCHEDULE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of section forty-five
2 of chapter thirty of the General Laws, the division of
3 personnel and standardization is hereby authorized and
4 directed to change the existing grades of all members
5 of the capitol police in the general salary schedule
6 established by chapter seven hundred and fifteen of
7 the acts of nineteen hundred and fifty-one by giving
8 to each position in the capitol police the same grade
9 number as is now given to the corresponding position
10 in the metropolitan district police. On the effective
11 date of this act each incumbent shall be given the
12 salary rate to which he would be entitled if the pro-
13 motion to his present grade had been deferred until
14 the effective date of this act.
