AN ACT PLACING THE OFFICES OF CLERKS AND ASSISTANT CLERKS OF CERTAIN DISTRICT COURTS UNDER THE COUNTY PERSONNEL BOARD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 49 of chapter 35 of the General
2 Laws is hereby amended by striking out the first
3 sentence, as most recently amended by section 2 of
4 chapter 611 of the acts of 1951, and inserting in place
5 thereof the following:— Every office and position
6 whereof the salary is wholly payable from the treasury
7 of one or more counties, or from funds administered
8 by and through county officials, excluding the offices
9 of county commissioners, the clerk and the assistant
10 clerks of the superior court for civil business in the
11 county of Suffolk, the clerk and assistant clerks of
12 the superior court for criminal business in the county
13 of Suffolk, clerks and assistant clerks of the courts,
14 the assistant clerk and second assistant clerk of the
15 supreme judicial court for the county of Suffolk, the

16 register of deeds and the assistant registers of deeds
17 for the county of Suffolk, official stenographers, addi-
18 tional stenographers and temporary stenographers of
19 the superior court in the county of Suffolk, justices
20 and special justices of the district courts, the messenger
21 of the superior court in the county of Suffolk, the
22 secretary and assistant secretary, clerks and assistant
23 clerks of the municipal court of the city of Boston,
24 the clerks and assistant clerks of the district court of
25 East Norfolk, first district court of eastern Middle-
26 sex, third district court of eastern Middlesex and
27 second district court of Bristol, trial justices, other
28 offices and positions filled by appointment of the gov-
29 ernor with the advice and consent of the council,
30 court officers appointed in Suffolk county under sec-
31 tion seventy of chapter two hundred and twenty-one,
32 court officers in attendance upon the municipal court
33 of the city of Boston, court officers in attendance upon
34 the probate court in the county of Essex, and proba-
35 tion officers, but including the officer described in the
36 first sentence of section seventy-six of said chapter
37 two hundred and twenty-one, shall be classified by
38 the board in the manner provided by sections forty-
39 eight to fifty-six, inclusive, and every such office and
40 position, now existing or hereafter established, shall
41 be allocated by the board to its proper place in such
42 classification.

1 SECTION 2. Section 77 of chapter 218 of the Gen-
2 eral Laws is hereby amended by striking out the sec-
3 ond sentence.

1 SECTION 3. Section 77A of chapter 218 of the Gen-
2 eral Laws, as most recently amended by section 1 of

3 chapter 603 of the acts of 1952, is hereby amended by
4 adding at the end of the third sentence the words:—
5 and of the district court of Springfield.

1 SECTION 4. Sections seventy-nine and eighty of
2 chapter two hundred and eighteen of the General Laws
3 are hereby repealed.

1 SECTION 5. Nothing in this act shall effect any
2 reduction in the regular compensation now being paid
3 to the clerks and assistant clerks of any court, and
4 the same shall remain in force until classification is
5 accomplished.

1 SECTION 6. This act shall take effect as of July
2 first, nineteen hundred and fifty-three.
