### RESOLVE IN FAVOR OF WALTER P. SHEA OF SPRINGFIELD.

1   *Resolved*, That for the purpose of discharging a  
2 moral obligation and notwithstanding any provision  
3 of section three B of chapter twelve of the General  
4 Laws to the contrary, there be allowed and paid out  
5 of the state treasury, subject to appropriation, to  
6 Walter P. Shea of Springfield, in satisfaction of an  
7 execution issued on final judgment from the Hampden  
8 Superior Court on November 26, 1951, in an action  
9 commenced by said Walter P. Shea against Charles J.  
10 Zablow, Jr., for damages resulting from an accident  
11 involving a state-owned motor vehicle operated by said  
12 Zablow while in the performance of his duties as a  
13 state employee, the sum of twelve thousand three  
14 hundred and seventy-one dollars and sixty-nine cents.
