AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF UPTON TO MAKE ADDITIONAL WATER LOANS AND ABOLISHING THE UPTON CENTER WATER DISTRICT IN THE TOWN OF UPTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. For the purpose of developing well
2 fields, extending the present water mains and water
3 system, erecting pumping station with pump, install-
4 ing new standpipe and improving water distribution
5 facilities, the town of Upton may borrow from time
6 to time such sums as may be necessary, not exceeding,
7 in the aggregate, two hundred and twenty-two thou-
8 sand dollars, and may issue bonds or notes therefor
9 which shall bear on their face the words, "Upton
10 Water Loan, Act of 1953." Each authorized issue
11 shall constitute a separate loan, and such loans shall
12 be payable in not more than thirty years from their
13 dates. Indebtedness incurred under this act shall be
14 within the limits of the amount prescribed by the last
15 paragraph of section eight of chapter forty-four of
16 the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. Chapter two hundred and twenty of
2 the acts of nineteen hundred and forty-six and chapter
3 one hundred and ninety-five of the acts of nineteen

4 hundred and forty-nine, relating to the establishment
5 of the Upton Center water district in the town of
6 Upton, are hereby repealed.

1 SECTION 3. The town of Upton shall assume and
2 be liable for any and all financial obligations which
3 have been incurred by the Upton Center water district
4 and which are outstanding and owed by said district
5 on the effective date of this act.

1 SECTION 4. This act shall be submitted to the
2 voters of the town of Upton at the next annual town
3 meeting in the form of the following question, which
4 shall be placed upon the official ballot to be used for
5 the election of town officers at said meeting: — “Shall
6 an act passed by the general court in the year nineteen
7 hundred and fifty-three, entitled, ‘An Act authorizing
8 the town of Upton to make additional water loans and
9 abolishing the Upton Center Water District in the
10 town of Upton,’ be accepted?” If a majority of the
11 votes in answer to said question is in the affirmative,
12 then this act shall thereupon take full effect, but not
13 otherwise.
