The committee on Aeronautics, to whom was referred the report of the committee on Aeronautics authorized (under the provisions of an order adopted by the Senate on January 26 and by the House on January 27) to continue the investigation (authorized under an order adopted by the Senate on August 27, 1951 and by the House on September 6, 1951) relative to certain matters pertaining to aeronautics (Senate, No. 615), report (in part) the accompanying order (House, No. 2651).

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

Ordered, That the committee on Aeronautics is hereby authorized to sit during the recess of the General Court for the purpose of investigating and studying and making a comprehensive survey, and to prepare a five-year plan for the future construction, enlargement and operation of General Edward Lawrence Logan Airport, including specific details with costs and priorities of projects submitted by competent technical consultants; and to further study the feasibility of an over-all revenue financial authority for Boston to include the development of all sea and ground transportation facilities and any other matters relating to aviation.

Said committee may travel within and without the commonwealth, and may expend for expenses and for technical, clerical and other assistance the balance of sums appropriated under item 0110-69 of section 2 of chapter 806 of the Acts of 1951, and item 0110-69 of section 2 of chapter 632 of the Acts of 1952, and such other sums as may be appropriated therefor.

Said committee shall report to the General Court the results of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the House of Representatives on or before March first, nineteen hundred and fifty-four.
