AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE AMOUNT OF RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE TO BE PAID TO FRANK MARSHALL BY THE COUNTY OF ESSEX UPON HIS RETIREMENT AS DEPUTY SHERIFF.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special
2 law to the contrary, Frank Marshall, employed by
3 the county of Essex as a deputy sheriff and court
4 officer, shall receive, in addition to the retirement
5 allowance granted under the retirement system, an
6 extra allowance, so that his total retirement allow-
7 ance shall equal forty-three per cent of the daily
8 compensation received by him at the time of his
9 retirement.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
