AN ACT PROVIDING THAT DOGS BE RESTRAINED FROM ROAMING
AT LARGE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 140 of the General Laws is hereby amended by in-
2 serting after section 168 the following section:—*Section*
3 *168A.* No person who owns or keeps a dog shall allow such
4 dog to run at large upon the land of another if such dog is not
5 under the control of the owner or keeper or an agent of the
6 owner or keeper, nor allow such dog to roam at large on any
7 portion of any public highway not adjacent to the premises of
8 the owner or keeper unless such dog is attended and under
9 control of such owner or keeper or his agent; provided, how-
10 ever, that this section shall not be construed to limit or pro-
11 hibit the use of hunting dogs during the open hunting season.
12 Whoever violates any provision of this section shall be pun-
13 ished by a fine of not more than twenty-five dollars or by im-
14 prisonment for not more than thirty days, or both.
