AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE BOARD OF REGISTRATION OF HAIRDRESSERS TO LICENSE BEAUTY SHOPS IN STATE INSTITUTIONS AND TO CREDIT OPERATORS EMPLOYED THEREIN.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 87AA of chapter 112 of the General Laws, as most  
2 recently amended by section 1 of chapter 537 of the acts of  
3 1953, is hereby further amended by adding at the end the fol-  
4 lowing paragraph: — The board may register beauty shops  
5 operated in state institutions for the sole purpose of crediting  
6 the operators employed therein with such practical experience  
7 so that they may qualify for the hairdressers' examination.
