RESOLVE REVIVING AND CONTINUING THE UNPAID SPECIAL COMMITTEE TO MAKE AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY RELATIVE TO THE ERECTION OF A MEMORIAL TO COLONEL THOMAS CASS AND THE OFFICERS AND MEN OF THE NINTH REGIMENT OF INFANTRY.

1 *Resolved*, That the unpaid special committee established
2 under the provisions of chapter seventy of the resolves of nine-
3 teen hundred and fifty-five to make an investigation and study
4 relative to a mural in commemoration of Colonel Thomas Cass
5 and the officers and men of the Ninth Regiment of Infantry, is
6 hereby revived and continued.

7 Said committee shall make suitable arrangements for the
8 one hundredth anniversary commemoration of the organiza-
9 tion of said regiment for service in the Civil War and for the
10 proper designation of the battle-flags of the regiment.

11 Said committee shall also arrange for the official acceptance
12 by the governor, in behalf of the commonwealth, of certain
13 flags carried by said regiment in the Spanish-American War
14 and now in process of rehabilitation at the Museum of Fine
15 Arts.

16 Said committee shall report to the general court the results
17 of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any,
18 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry said rec-
19 ommendations into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of
20 the senate on or before the third Tuesday of January in the
21 year nineteen hundred and sixty-one.
