The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty.

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH COUNCILLOR AND SENATORIAL DISTRICTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 57 of the General Laws is hereby
 2 amended by striking out Section 2 as most recently amended
 3 by Section 1 of Chapter 250 of the Acts of 1948, and inserting
 4 in place thereof the following:

5 *Section 2.* For the purpose of choosing councillors until
 6 the next decennial apportionment, the commonwealth is
 7 divided, conformably with the constitution, into the following
 8 eight councillor districts:

9 *First.* — Consisting of Cape and Plymouth, the first, second,
 10 and third Bristol, and the Norfolk and Plymouth senatorial
 11 districts.

12 *Second.* — Consisting of the second Norfolk, the Norfolk
 13 and Middlesex, the Norfolk and Suffolk, the Plymouth, and
 14 the sixth Suffolk senatorial districts.

15 *Third.* — Consisting of the first, fifth, sixth, and seventh
 16 Middlesex, and the Middlesex and Worcester senatorial dis-
 17 tricts.

18 *Fourth.* — Consisting of the first Norfolk, and the first,
 19 second, fourth, and seventh Suffolk senatorial districts.

20 *Fifth.* — Consisting of the first, second, third, fourth, and
 21 fifth Essex senatorial districts.

22 *Sixth.* — Consisting of the second, third, fourth, Middlesex,
 23 and the third and fifth Suffolk senatorial districts.

24 *Seventh.* — Consisting of the first, second, third, and fourth

25 Worcester, and the Worcester and Hampden senatorial dis-
26 tricts.

27 *Eighth.* — Consisting of the Berkshire, the Franklin and
28 Hampshire, the first and second Hampden, and the Hampden
29 and Berkshire senatorial districts.

1 SECTION 2. Said Chapter 57 is hereby further amended
2 by striking out section 3, as most recently amended by sec-
3 tion 2 of chapter 250 of the acts of 1948, and inserting in place
4 thereof the following section: — *Section 3.* For the purpose
5 of choosing senators until the next decennial apportionment,
6 the commonwealth is divided conformably with the constitu-
7 tion into the following senatorial districts: —

8 *Berkshire.* — Consisting of the cities of North Adams and
9 Pittsfield, and the towns of Adams, Cheshire, Clarksburg, Dal-
10 ton, Florida, Hancock, Hinsdale, Lanesborough, Lee, Lenox,
11 New Ashford, Peru, Savoy, Washington, Williamstown, and
12 Windsor, all in the county of Berkshire.

13 *First Bristol.* — Consisting of the cities of Attleboro and
14 Taunton, and the towns of Berkley, Dighton, North Attle-
15 borough, Norton, Raynham, Rehoboth, Seekonk, Somerset and
16 Swansea, all in the county of Bristol.

17 *Second Bristol.* — Consisting of the city of Fall River and
18 the towns of Acushnet and Freetown, all in the county of
19 Bristol.

20 *Third Bristol.* — Consisting of the city of New Bedford and
21 the town of Dartmouth, all in the county of Bristol.

22 *Cape and Plymouth.* — Consisting of the towns in Barn-
23 stable, Dukes and Nantucket counties, and the towns of Fair-
24 haven and Westport, all in the county of Bristol, and the towns
25 of Mattapoisett, Marion, Plymouth, Rochester and Wareham,
26 all in the county of Plymouth.

27 *First Essex.* — Consisting of the city of Lynn, and the towns
28 of Nahant and Swampscott, all in the county of Essex.

29 *Second Essex.* — Consisting of the cities of Beverly, Pea-
30 body and Salem, and the town of Marblehead, all in the county
31 of Essex.

32 *Third Essex.* — Consisting of the city of Gloucester, and
33 the towns of Boxford, Danvers, Essex, Georgetown, Grove-

34 land, Hamilton, Ipswich, Lynnfield, Manchester, Middle-
35 ton, Newbury, Rockport, Rowley, Topsfield, Wenham, and
36 West Newbury, all in the county of Essex; and the towns of
37 North Reading, and Reading, all in the county of Middle-
38 sex.

39 *Fourth Essex.* — Consisting of the cities of Haverhill and
40 Newburyport, and the towns Amesbury, Andover, Merrimac,
41 North Andover, and Salisbury, all in the county of Essex.

42 *Fifth Essex.* — Consisting of the city of Lawrence and the
43 town of Methuen, both in the county of Essex.

44 *Franklin and Hampshire.* — Consisting of all of the towns
45 in the county of Franklin; and the city of Northampton, and
46 the towns of Amherst, Chesterfield, Cummington, Easthamp-
47 ton, Goshen, Granby, Hadley, Hatfield, Huntington, Pelham,
48 Plainfield, South Hadley, Southampton, Williamsburg, and
49 Westhampton, all in the county of Hampshire.

50 *First Hampden.* — Consisting of wards numbered two, four,
51 five, six, seven, and eight of the city of Springfield, and the
52 town of Ludlow, all in the County of Hampden.

53 *Second Hampden.* — Consisting of the cities of Chicopee and
54 Holyoke, and ward numbered one of the city of Springfield,
55 all in the county of Hampden.

56 *Hampden and Berkshire.* — Consisting of the towns of Al-
57 ford, Beckett, Egremont, Great Barrington, Monterey, Mount
58 Washington, New Marlborough, Otis, Richmond, Sandisfield,
59 Sheffield, Stockbridge, Tyringham and West Stockbridge, all
60 in the county of Berkshire; ward numbered three of the city
61 of Springfield and the city of Westfield, and the towns of Aga-
62 wam, Blandford, Chester, East Longmeadow, Granville, Long-
63 meadow, Montgomery, Russell, Southwick, Tolland, and West
64 Springfield, all in the county of Hampden; and the towns of
65 Middlefield and Worthington, in the county of Hampshire.

66 *First Middlesex.* — Consisting of the city of Lowell, and
67 the towns of Ashby, Dracut, Dunstable, Groton, Pepperrell,
68 Townsend, and Tyngsborough, all in the county of Middlesex.

69 *Second Middlesex.* — Consisting of wards numbered four,
70 five, six, seven, eight, nine, ten, and eleven in the city of Cam-
71 bridge; the ward numbered seven in the city of Somerville;

72 and the town of Belmont, all in the county of Middlesex.

73 *Third Middlesex.* — Consisting of ward numbered three in
74 the city of Cambridge; ward numbered two in the city of
75 Malden; wards numbered one and seven in the city of Medford;
76 wards numbered one, two, three, four, five, and six in the city
77 of Somerville, all in the county of Middlesex.

78 *Fourth Middlesex.* — Consisting of wards numbered two,
79 three, four, and six in the city of Everett; wards numbered
80 one, three, four, five, six, seven, and eight in the city of Mal-
81 den; and the city of Melrose, all in the county of Middlesex.

82 *Fifth Middlesex.* — Consisting of the city of Waltham, and
83 the towns of Ayer, Bedford, Carlisle, Chelmsford, Concord,
84 Lincoln, Littleton, Shirley, Watertown, and Westford, all in
85 the county of Middlesex.

86 *Sixth Middlesex.* — Consisting of wards numbered two,
87 three, four, five, and six in the city of Medford, and the towns
88 of Arlington, and Winchester, all in the county of Middlesex.

89 *Seventh Middlesex.* — Consisting of the city of Woburn,
90 and the towns of Billerica, Burlington, Lexington, Stoneham,
91 Tewksbury, Wakefield and Wilmington, all in the county of
92 Middlesex.

93 *Middlesex and Worcester.* — Consisting of the city of Marl-
94 borough, and the towns of Acton, Ashland, Boxborough, Fram-
95 ingham, Holliston, Hopkinton, Hudson, Maynard, Natick, Sher-
96 born, Stow, Sudbury and Wayland, all in the county of Middle-
97 sex; and the towns of Berlin, Bolton, Harvard, Lancaster and
98 Northborough in the county of Worcester.

99 *First Norfolk.* — Consisting of the city of Quincy, and the
100 towns of Braintree and Randolph, all in the county of Norfolk.

101 *Second Norfolk.* — Consisting of the towns of Easton and
102 Mansfield, both in the county of Bristol; and the towns
103 of Bellingham, Canton, Dover, Foxboro, Franklin, Med-
104 field, Medway, Millis, Norfolk, Norwood, Plainville, Sharon,
105 Walpole, Westwood, and Wrentham, all in the county of Nor-
106 folk.

107 *Norfolk and Middlesex.* — Consisting of the towns of Ded-
108 ham, Needham and Wellesley, all in the county of Norfolk;
109 and wards numbered two, three, four, and five in the city of

110 Newton, and the town of Weston, all in the county of Middle-
111 sex.

112 *Norfolk and Plymouth.* — Consisting of the towns of Cohas-
113 set, Holbrook and Weymouth, both in the county of Norfolk;
114 and the towns of Carver, Duxbury, Halifax, Hanover, Hanson,
115 Hingham, Hull, Kingston, Lakeville, Marshfield, Middleboro,
116 Norwell, Pembroke, Plympton, Scituate, and Whitman, all in
117 the county of Plymouth.

118 *Norfolk and Suffolk.* — Consisting of wards numbered one,
119 six, and seven, in the city of Newton, in the county of Middle-
120 sex; and the town of Brookline, in the county of Norfolk; and
121 ward numbered twenty-two in the city of Boston, in the county
122 of Suffolk.

123 *Plymouth.* — Consisting of the towns of Avon and Stough-
124 ton, in the county of Norfolk; the city of Brockton, and the
125 towns of Abington, Bridgewater, East Bridgewater, Rockland
126 and West Bridgewater, all in the county of Plymouth.

127 *First Suffolk.* — Consisting of the town of Saugus, in the
128 county of Essex; wards numbered one and five in the city of
129 Everett in the county of Middlesex; and the cities of Chelsea
130 and Revere, and the town of Winthrop, all in the county of
131 Suffolk.

132 *Second Suffolk.* — Consisting of ward numbered one in the
133 city of Cambridge, in the county of Middlesex; and wards num-
134 bered one, two, and three of the city of Boston, in the county
135 of Suffolk.

136 *Third Suffolk.* — Consisting of ward numbered two in the
137 city of Cambridge, in the county of Middlesex; wards num-
138 bered four, five, and twenty-one in the city of Boston, in the
139 county of Suffolk.

140 *Fourth Suffolk.* — Consisting of wards numbered six, seven,
141 eight, nine and thirteen in the city of Boston, in the county
142 of Suffolk.

143 *Fifth Suffolk.* — Consisting of wards numbered ten, eleven,
144 nineteen and twenty in the city of Boston, in the county of
145 Suffolk.

146 *Sixth Suffolk.* — Consisting of wards numbered twelve,
147 fourteen and eighteen in the city of Boston, in the county of
148 Suffolk.

149 *Seventh Suffolk.* — Consisting of wards numbered fifteen,
150 sixteen and seventeen in the city of Boston and county of Suf-
151 folk; and the town of Milton in the county of Norfolk.

152 *First Worcester.* — Consisting of wards numbered four, five,
153 six, seven and eight of the city of Worcester, and the towns
154 of Leicester and Millbury, all in the county of Worcester.

155 *Second Worcester.* — Consisting of wards numbered one,
156 two, three, nine and ten of the city of Worcester, and the
157 towns of Holden and West Boylston, all in the county of Wor-
158 cester.

159 *Third Worcester.* — Consisting of the cities of Fitchburg,
160 Gardner, and Leominster, and the towns of Ashburnham,
161 Boylston, Clinton, Lunenburg, Sterling and Westminster, all
162 in the county of Worcester.

163 *Fourth Worcester.* — Consisting of the towns of Auburn,
164 Blackstone, Douglas, Dudley, Grafton, Hopedale, Mendon,
165 Milford, Millville, Northbridge, Oxford, Shrewsbury, South-
166 borough, Sutton, Upton, Uxbridge, Webster and Westborough,
167 all in the county of Worcester.

168 *Worcester and Hampden.* — Consisting of the towns of Brim-
169 field, Hampden, Holland, Monson, Palmer, Wales and Wilbra-
170 ham in the county of Hampden; and the towns of Belchertown
171 and Ware in the county of Hampshire; and the towns of Athol,
172 Barre, Brookfield, Charlton, East Brookfield, Hardwick, Hub-
173 bardston, New Braintree, North Brookfield, Oakham, Paxton,
174 Petersham, Phillipston, Princeton, Royalston, Rutland, South-
175 bridge, Spencer, Sturbridge, Templeton, Warren, West Brook-
176 field, and Winchendon, all in the county of Worcester.

1 SECTION 3. The supreme judicial court shall have jurisdic-
2 tion of any petition for a writ of mandamus relative to the
3 establishment of councillor and senatorial districts under sec-
4 tion two of this act. Every such petition shall be filed in court
5 within ten days after the effective date of this act.

1 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
